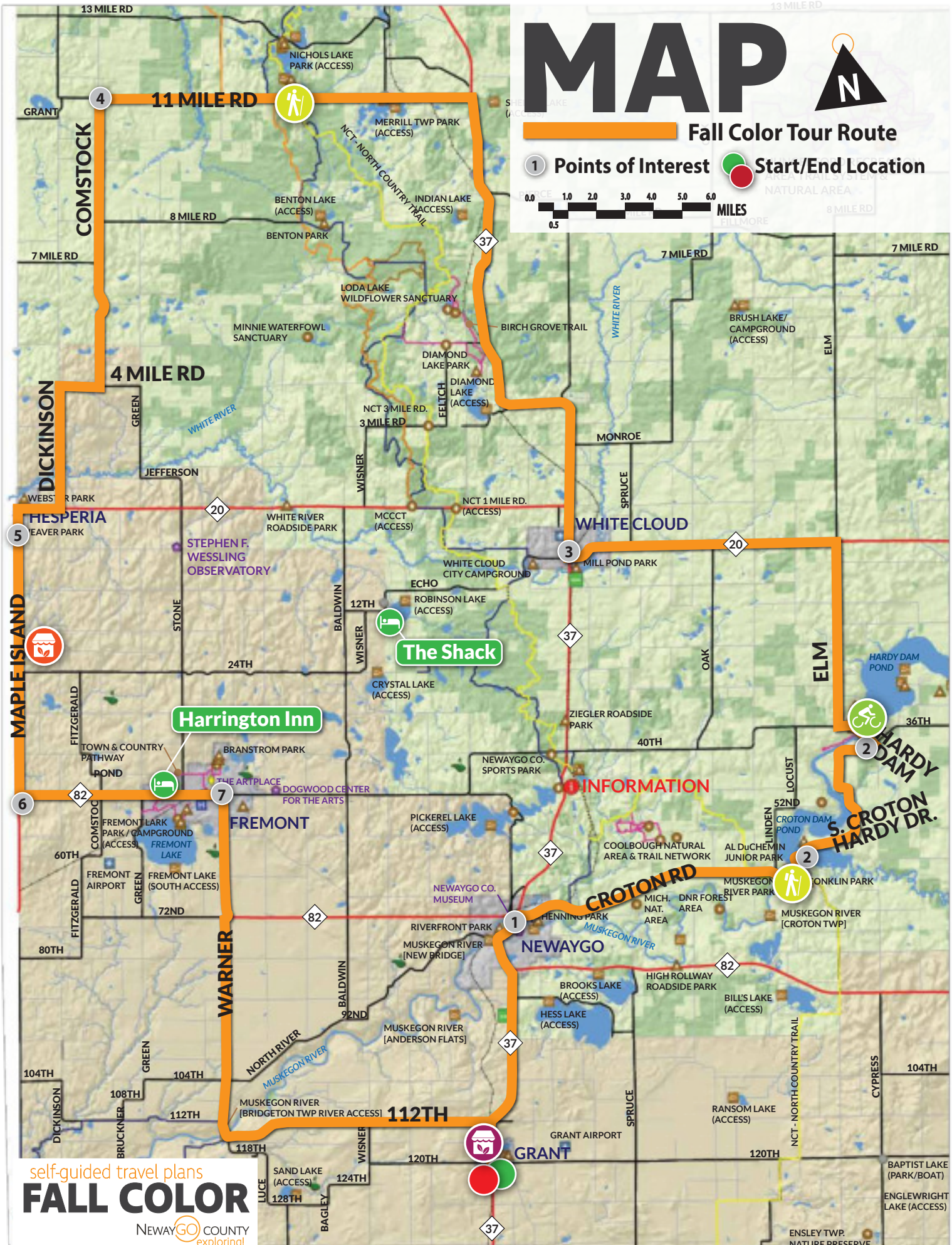


MAP

Hot Spots along the Route

- 1 Downtown Newaygo-shops & dining & walking trail along Muskegon River.
- 2 Hardy Dam on the north and Croton Dam on the south. Walk the trail at Conklin Park for a high view of Croton Dam or the Hardy Dam Rustic Trail.
- 3 White Cloud features Rotary & Millpond Parks along the White River.
- 4 This stretch south of 11 Mile has rolling hills that give great vistas of color.
- 5 A block north is Hesperia's dam for photos of fish jumping.
- 6 This corner has several Amish businesses.
- 7 Fremont has many resale shops and restaurants.

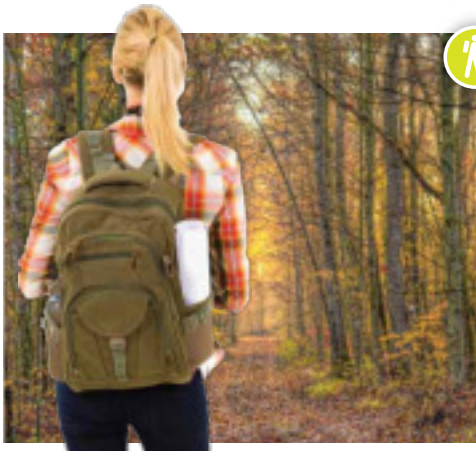
Trails you want to experience this fall...



Michigan's Dragon At Hardy Dam

The Dragon is a world-class mountain biking, hiking and running trail with a 47-mile complete loop around the Hardy Dam Pond. Currently, there are currently 6+ miles open, with continued construction planned thru 2020/2021. The trail provides direct access to pristine forests, parks, campgrounds and an incredible natural landscape.

When the trail network is completed, there will be an ADA accessible trail segment, 13 scenic overlooks, 23 bridges, and all along the shores of the world's third largest earthen dam. Experience the 4,000 acre Hardy Dam Pond, over 2,000 campsites, and countless outdoor recreation opportunities on more than 5,000 acres of land made available for the public by Consumers Energy.



North Country Trail

This beautiful trail is part of the National Parks Trails System and when completed, the 4,600-mile National Scenic Trail will be the longest continuous hiking trail in the United States, traversing through eight states, from Vermont to North Dakota. The trail links scenic, natural, historic, and cultural areas allowing visitors to experience a variety of northern landscapes. White Cloud is located about midpoint on the trail and the restored 100-year-old Birch Grove School House at the corner of Five Mile and Felch roads was the former headquarters for the National Scenic Trail.
